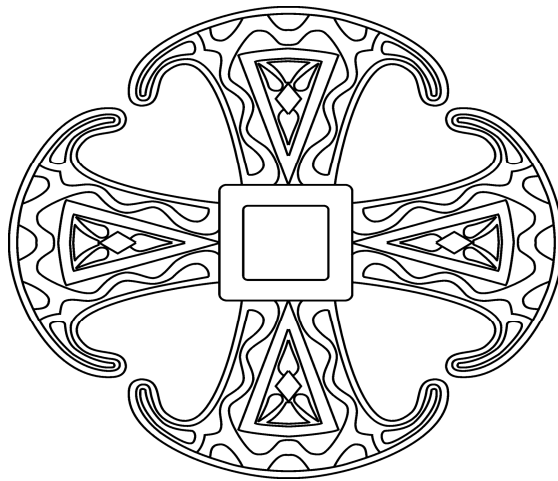



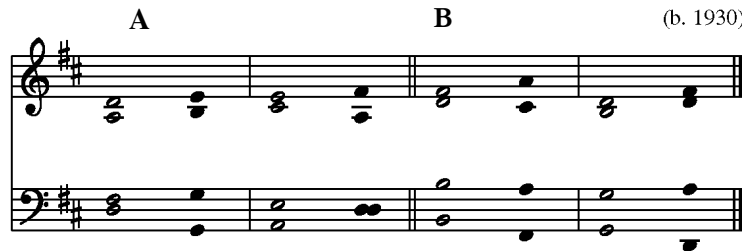

Participants are also asked to arrive by 5:45 pm to practice as a group. Everyone is welcome to attend the SOUP & BREAD SUPPER that follows the service. Youth are also welcome to stay during the presentation that begins at 7:30 pm. The youth will decorate the boxes that will be used to send books to deployed troops through *Operation Paperback*.

Lenten Supper Sign-ups: The sign-up sheet for the SOUP & BREAD SUPPERS that follow the Stations of Cross every Friday evening of Lent is in Julian Hall.
