## PLEASE PLAN TO ATTEND

### **ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MISSION**

The Annual Meeting of the Mission will take place on Sunday, **January 29**. The schedule will be similar to previous years; the luncheon and meeting will follow the regular Sunday morning schedule of all three worship services. Please begin praying about the possibility that God is calling you to serve on the Bishop's Committee or as a Delegate to the 2013 Diocesan Convention.

- **The Nine Bishop's Committee Members** are responsible for working with the Vicar to provide the leadership for the Church. Each Bishop's Committee Member is responsible for coordinating/supporting a specific area of ministry. This includes helping to set goals, identifying programs and projects, being accountable to budgets, recruiting participants, and much, much more. Three Bishop's Committee Members—each full-term (three years)—will be added during the Annual Meeting of the Mission to continue a complement of nine total members.
