LENTEN LANDSCAPE PREPARATION PARTY



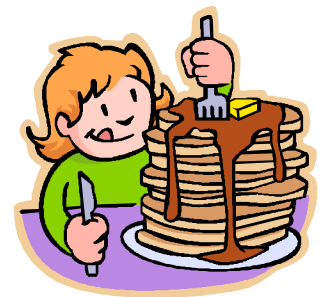

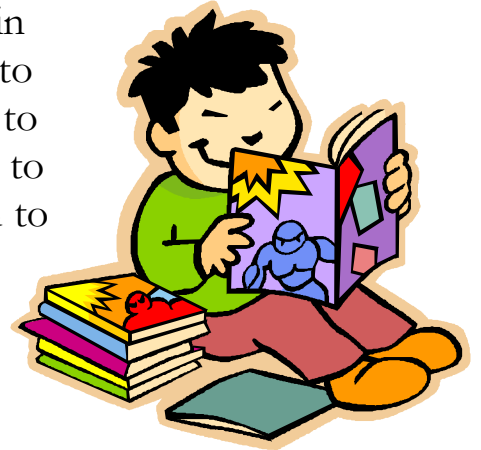
